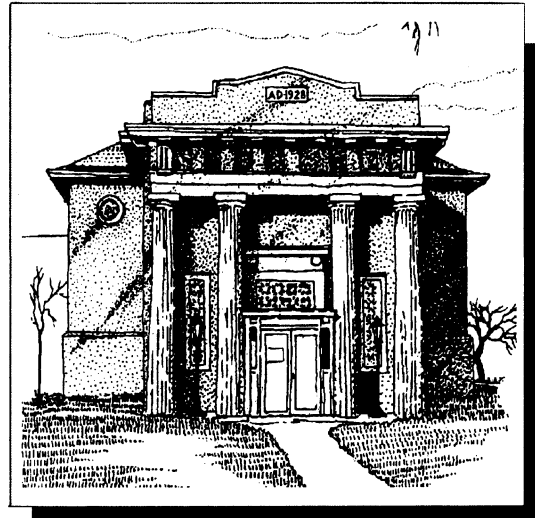

MUNICIPAL HERITAGE AWARDS

The Municipal Heritage Awards program recognizes individuals or organizations who have helped to enhance the quality of life in Regina through demonstrated commitment to the heritage of our community. The program was established in 1984 and the award ceremony is held annually to coincide with National Heritage Day on the third Monday in February.

AWARD CATEGORIES

Awards are presented in any or all of the following categories:

- 1. Restoration - Exterior:** *The careful reconstruction of a building exterior to a certain period in its history, using the materials, styles and craftsmanship of that period.*
- 2. Restoration - Interior:** *The careful reconstruction of a building interior to a certain period in its history, using the materials, styles and craftsmanship of that period.*
- 3. Adaptive Re-use:** *The adaptive re-use of a heritage property involving physical changes to an older structure, in order to prolong its physical and economic viability while retaining its heritage character and integrity.*
- 4. New Design - Sensitive Infill:** *New design which is sympathetic to heritage properties and streetscapes with respect to building scale, height, massing, roofline and finishing materials, in existing developed areas or neighbourhoods.*
- 5. New Design - Sensitive Addition:** *New design involving a structural addition(s) to an existing heritage building that is (are) sympathetic to or compatible with the original or established building design with respect to scale, height, massing, fenestration, roofline and/or finishing materials.*
- 6. Heritage Open Space:** *The promotion, restoration and new design of heritage open spaces, sites, monuments and trails.*
- 7. Education:** *Endeavours which enhance the public understanding and appreciation of Regina's natural and human heritage.*
- 8. George Bothwell Heritage Award for Public Service:** *Volunteer involvement and commitment to heritage activities which enrich community life in Regina.*

NOMINATION PROCEDURE

For nominations in categories 1 through 6, please submit a written description of the nature and extent of the project, relating specifically to the relevant category, and provide visual documentation in the form of plans, sketches and/or photographs. Nominations will be accepted for projects which were undertaken or completed in the current year and the preceding year. A project can be nominated in more than one category.

Residential, public, commercial and industrial buildings are eligible for nomination in categories 1 through 5.

For nominations in categories 7 and 8, please include the name, affiliated organization (if any) and details of the contributions or achievements of the person(s) nominated.

Nominators are responsible for informing individuals, organizations and owners of projects, of their respective nominations.

SELECTION PROCEDURE

A Subcommittee of the Regina Municipal Heritage Advisory Committee (MHAC) reviews all of the nominations and recommends the award winners for approval by MHAC.

The awards, in the form of framed certificates, are presented to the winners by the Mayor at the Council meeting deemed to be closest to National Heritage Day, the third Monday in February.
